The Ekklesia: God's Called-Out Ones

From The Apostle's Heart

Beloved in Christ,

As we continue into this new year, the Lord is calling His people back to identity—back to understanding who we are, why we exist, and what we have been commissioned to do. Many people view “church” as a building, a weekly service, or a religious routine. But biblically, the Church is far more than an event.

Jesus said in Matthew 16:18, “I will build my Ekklesia, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.” He did not say He would build a social club. He did not say He would build a denomination. He said He would build His Ekklesia—His called-out assembly—His governing people who carry His authority, reflect His holiness, and advance His Kingdom in the earth.

This month, we are going to look closely at what it means to be the Ekklesia, how the Church is designed to function, and why unity is not optional if we are going to fulfill God's purpose.

Scripture Feature

“And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Ekklesia, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.”

— Matthew 16:18

Jesus speaks with certainty: “I will build.” The Church is not sustained by human strength. It is built by Christ. And because it is built by Him, it cannot be defeated by the forces of darkness.

The gates of Hades represent defensive structures—meaning hell is not advancing; it is resisting. The Ekklesia is the force moving forward, empowered by the Holy Spirit, carrying truth, and pushing back darkness.

What Does It Mean to Be the Ekklesia?



The word Ekklesia comes from the Greek meaning “called-out ones”—an assembly of people summoned for a purpose. In the ancient world, an ekklesia was a governing gathering of citizens. Spiritually, the Ekklesia is God’s people called out of darkness and commissioned to represent His Kingdom.

Three Key Aspects of Our Identity

1. Called to Be Holy

“But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation...” (1 Peter 2:9)

Holiness is not perfection—it is separation. We belong to God, and our lives should reflect His character.

2. United in Christ

“There is one body and one Spirit... one Lord, one faith, one baptism.” (Ephesians 4:4–6)

Unity does not mean we all look the same or worship the same way. It means we are joined by one Savior and one mission.

3. Ambassadors of the Kingdom

“We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors...” (2 Corinthians 5:20)

We represent God’s Kingdom in our homes, workplaces, communities, and churches. We are not meant to blend in—we are meant to shine.

The Purpose of the Ekklesia

Jesus established the Ekklesia with a mission. We are not called out to sit down—we are called out to stand up.

Core Purposes of the Church

Worship: Glorifying God above all else

Discipleship: Growing believers into maturity



Evangelism: Sharing the gospel boldly

Community: Building spiritual family and accountability

Service: Meeting needs and reflecting Christ's compassion

When the Ekklesia operates as God designed, the Body of Christ becomes strong, unified, and effective.

The Power of the Ekklesia

The Ekklesia is not powerless. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to advance God's purposes.

How the Church Operates in Power

Through Prayer

“After they prayed... they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.” (Acts 4:31)

By Living in Unity

Unity is not a preference—it is spiritual warfare. Division weakens our witness, but unity strengthens our authority.

Through Spiritual Authority

“Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven...” (Matthew 18:18)

The Church has authority—not to control people, but to confront darkness and proclaim truth.



Challenges Facing the Ekklesia (And How We Overcome)

1. Division

Division distracts from the mission. The enemy loves a divided Church because it becomes ineffective. We overcome division by choosing reconciliation and humility.

2. Cultural Conformity

The Church must not dilute truth to fit the world. We are called to stand firm in Scripture, even when it's unpopular.

3. Apathy

A passionless Church becomes stagnant. Revival begins when hearts return to prayer, holiness, and obedience.

Community Connection
